Profile 2016-2017

El Camino High School at Ventura College is an independent study high school in the Ventura Unified School District. Students are offered an individualized four year high school curriculum for grades 9 through 12 that is fully accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Advanced Placement, Honors and college-preparatory courses are offered. (Please refer to the U.C. Pathways website for current list of certified courses.) In 2010, El Camino High School was selected as a Model Independent High School by the California Department of Education and in 2013 was designated as a California Distinguished School. Students work independently on assigned courses under the close supervision of a mentor teacher. ECHS is competency based; all courses and tests must be passed with 70% or better. **Students are also required to enroll concurrently at Ventura Community College for enrichment, career exploration, and advanced study.**

Students may request to enroll at ECHS through the Ventura Unified School District Alternate Placement Committee. Criteria for acceptance into the program include strong reading and math skills as well as other academic and personal factors. Students may enroll at ECHS throughout the school year and may transfer back to a traditional high school at the beginning of the fall or spring semesters.

Independent study students also have the option of participating in competitive sports through the programs at their boundary high schools in Ventura Unified School District. Students have flexibility of time in order to participate in internships, community service, professional and semi-professional endeavors.

College preparatory and select honors and Advanced Placement courses meet the A-G requirements for the University of California or California State University and prepare students for high level scholastic achievement, vocational programs and employment.
